
## CAN YOU SPEAK ROBOT?

## THINK ABOUT . . .

Phonemic Awareness skills are important when building a foundation for literacy. Segmenting is the ability to break a word into sounds, for example, knowing "cat" becomes c-a-t. Conversely, blending is the ability to put segmented words together, for example, a child can hear the sounds c-a-t, and identify the word as "cat."



• Teach the concept for as long as necessary. Make sure the child is reliable in their answers before increasing complexity.
